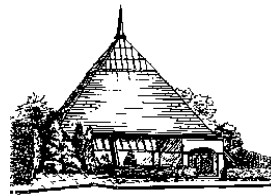
Now that the Small Hall is back in use we are pleased to say that we will be holding a Quiz for our first meeting there starting at 2pm.

FOOD BANK UPDATE

Our local Food Bank continues to experience a high level of demand for essential food and cleaning items. Donations from several churches and community groups are received and sorted by a team of volunteers at the project depot in Ruxley Lane, West Ewell. Regular weekly distributions to families and individuals then take place at Epsom Methodist Church, Merland Rise Community Centre, West Ewell Church, an office in Leatherhead and the Banstead Open Door Project at All Saints Church.

We learned recently that the project also collects and distributes other items such as bed linen and furniture, including quite bulky items. **Please speak to Jenny Newman or Mark Chessell for further details.**
